

Animal Centre Uniform and Dress Code

THE FOLLOWING GUIDELINES APPLY TO LEARNERS ON ALL ANIMAL SCIENCE COURSES.

In order to work in the Animal Centre during the course of your study programme you will need to adhere to the following dress code. These basic expectations mirror those of the animal industry and are for the health and safety of all staff, students and animals. Failure to comply to the dress code will mean you cannot attend the practical session and will result in disciplinary action; repeat offences may impinge on a student's ability to achieve practical units essential to passing their course.

STUDENT UNIFORM:

- Navy blue SGS Student polo shirt
- Long sleeved SGS Student jumper or thermal top underneath polo shirt for colder days
- Full length work trousers - black
- Mid or high work boots or wellies – waterproof preferred, steel-cap optional
- Plain coloured (preferably navy blue or black) woolly hat or non-logoed baseball cap for working outdoors
- Long hair needs be tied back
- Nails need to be kept short and free of nail polish when working in animal centre
- Piercings should be removed, if possible

NOT PERMITTED:

- Jeans, leggings, or thin, loose trousers
- Shorts, cropped trousers or skirts
- Hooded sweatshirts
- Open footwear or soft fabric shoes such as plimsoles or trainers
- Logoed outerwear
- Jewellery
 - Hoops or dangling piercings, of any kind
 - Piercings that are difficult to remove can be worn but only studs or bars worn
- Nail varnish or acrylic nails

Failure to Comply with the Dress Code

You will **NOT** be permitted to work in the animal centre if you are not appropriately dressed. You will be asked to report to the Learning Area Manager and set an alternative task to complete in the college library. Repeat occasions of failure to comply with the dress code will be treated as a disciplinary matter. You are encouraged to acquire all necessary uniform as soon as possible when starting on a new course. However, to allow for ordering and delivery of appropriate items, there will be a period of leniency for the first **5 weeks** of your course. Your group tutor will notify you of the cut-off date for this period, at which point you will be required to have all necessary clothing items and comply to the code completely.
