Glossary

Timely Leavers - A count of enrolments expected to complete in 19/20

Timely ret% best - The best case retention rate if all learners who are currently with us are retained to the end of the course

Timely ret% best Status - An indicator of performance against college targets

Description: Retention is a measure of our success in keeping learners with us to the end of their course. It is an expression of the percentage of those learners who were originally enrolled who have been retained.

KPI Group A1: Leadership of change, leading to improvement

- **Cumulative sickness % (leading)**

Reported quarterly in Dec (Sep-Nov absence); March (Dec - Feb absence); June (Mar-May Absence); and Sept (June-Aug absence) showing each month within the quarter for trend, plus the corresponding data from the previous year. Sector benchmark information, available is from the AOC, will be included within the HR Annual Report (October Corporation Report)

- **Staff vacancies vs Target (as a percentage of income) (leading) by areas/curriculum sector**

Reported monthly, the number of vacancies overall and by faculty as a percentage of roles in each faculty/function. This can be compared against the income ratio in the monthly management accounts. Sector benchmark information, available is from the AOC, will be included within the HR Annual Report (October Corporation Report)

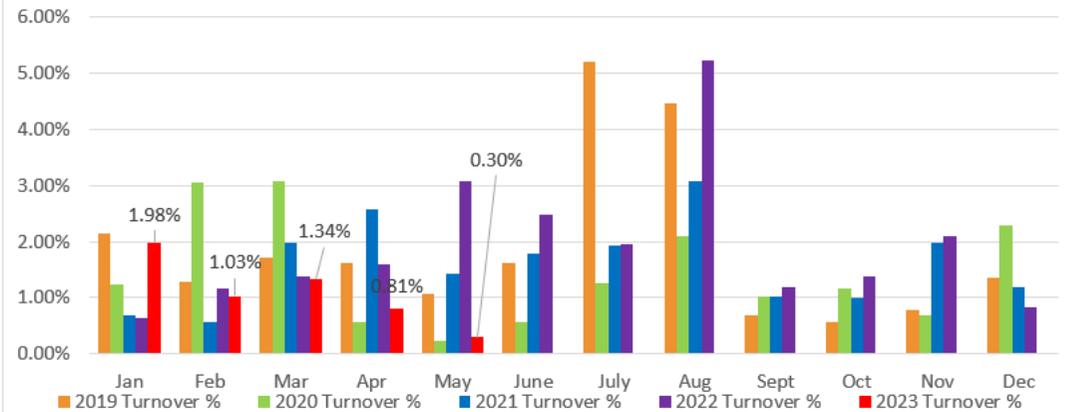

- **Staff annual conversations completion rate (lagging)** Reported twice, once in July and the again in October through the Annual Staff report (October Corporation Report)

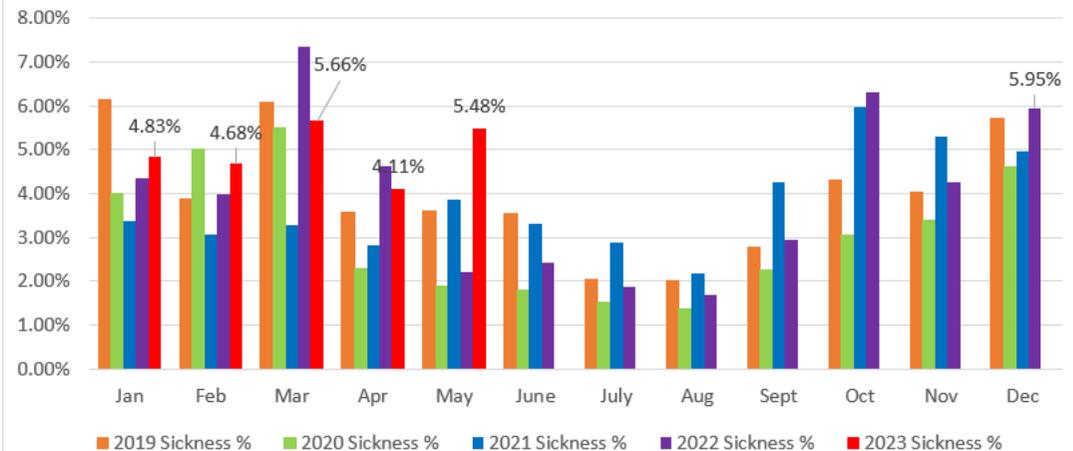
- **Staff survey (lagging, reported every other year)**

KPI Group A3: Leadership of change, leading to improvement

- Percentage of staff on action plans and capability, broken down by sector (leading) x 3/Term**
 Reported in line with the current TLA reports, scheduled within the Corporation Business Plan to occur in November, March and June.
- Staff development engagement completion of mandatory training (leading)**
 Reported termly in Dec (Sep-Nov completion); April (Dec – March completion); July (April-July completion), plus the corresponding data from the previous year. Sector benchmark information isn't available but we can report overall staff completion alongside annual review of the professional development policy (supplest reporting to Corporation annually, suggest July Corporation meeting (note: audit requirement of policy approval))

Note: the high percentage of teachers on action plans in Construction and Apprentice provision (indicated as amber) triggered a deep-dive in both areas. So far construction has been completed and an action plan for improvement implemented.

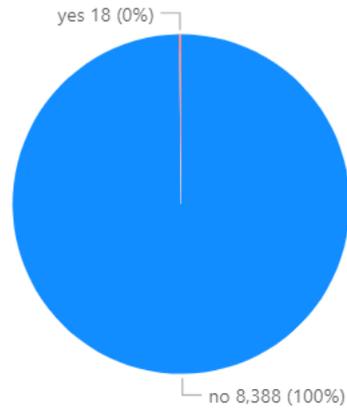

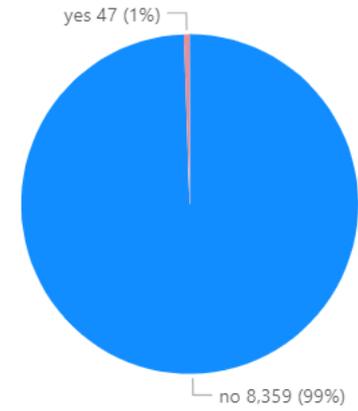
Learners by school meals



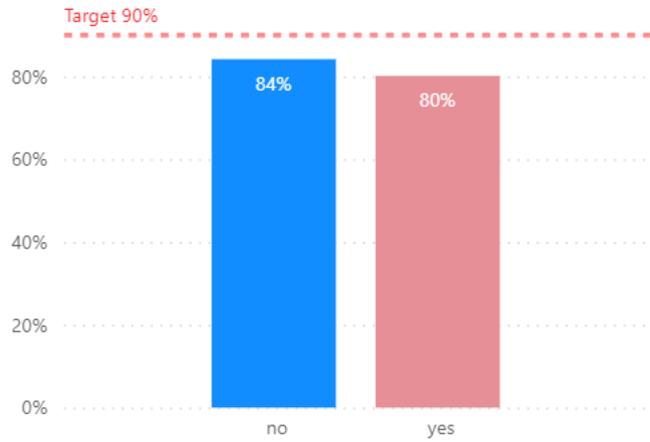
Learners by care leaver



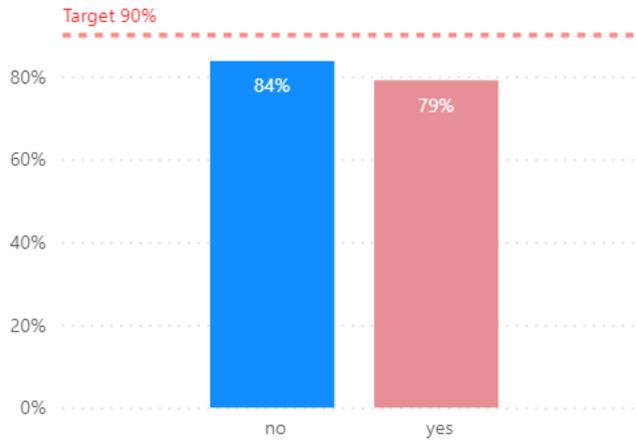
Learners by looked after



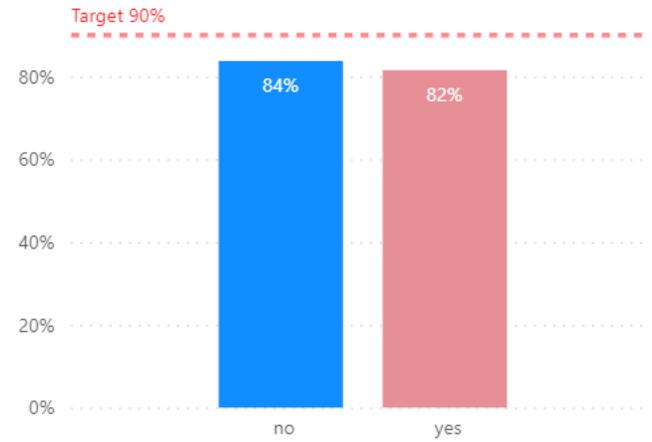
Attendance by school meals
